**MARCH 18, 2020**

Today, the Plentywood City Council made the decision to close Plentywood City Hall to walk-in customers to do our part to reduce the dangers of contamination from the Coronavirus.

This closure will begin on Thursday, March 19, 2020 and will remain in effect until further notice.

The City will stay in operation to conduct its regular business, but without the convenience of having its doors open for personal service. City Clerk Kelly Thiel and Office Assistant Elizabeth Samuelson will be ready to take your calls about utility billing or other matters needing attention. You are also welcome to call with any questions concerning how this closure will affect City activities. Our phone numbers remain 765-1700 for Kelly and Elizabeth and 765-1740 for City Attorney John Hunt. As usual, City Hall will be open during its regular times from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. except during the Noon Hour.

Payment of utility bills or Court fines, or other messaging may be sent through the mail to the City Hall address: 205 West 1<sup>st</sup> Ave., Plentywood, MT 59254. As before, payments or communications can be made through the “drop box” on the front of the building. To discuss special matters, like a zoning permit, you may call Kelly or Elizabeth with your questions.

The goal of the Mayor and Council is to keep the City running with the same services and the same schedule. Your support is greatly appreciated but we also want to hear any suggestions you have to make things better.

We regret having to take what would have been, until this week, a drastic, unprecedented act. But, given our need to protect the health and safety of all who live or visit here, it is now necessary for us to do what we can to prevent what harm may otherwise result from less care and concern for ourselves.
